

NEW DIR REQUIREMENTS

SENATE BILL 854

- June 20, 2014 - Established
- July 1, 2014 – Contractors must register \$ 300.00 annual renewal fees required. DIR (Department of Industrial Relations) will publish a list so that public entities can verify and be in compliance.
- January 15, 2015- Public entity call for bids must state that the project is subject to compliance monitoring and enforcement by the DIR (Department of Industrial Relations) Public entity must also state that the prime contractor is required to post job site notices, as prescribed by regulation.
- March 1, 2015 – Contractors and sub-contractors must be registered with DIR and be on the list. Public entity is now required to include verbiage in the bid docs.
- April 1, 2015 – Public entity to use ONLY registered contractors and subs on all public works.
- Within 5 days of award Public entity must file PWC-100 online
- AB 44 Subcontractors must include a contractor's license number

APPROVED LANGUAGE FOR THE ADVERTISEMENT

Bidders are advised that this contract is a public work for purposes of the California Labor Code, which requires payment of prevailing wages. Wage rates can be obtained from the Department of Industrial Relations at <http://www.dir.ca.gov/OPRL/dprevagedetermination.htm> As of March 1, 2015 all contractors bidding on a public works project must be registered with the Department of Industrial Relations pursuant to Labor Code section 1725.5. <http://www.dir.ca.gov/public-works/publicworks.html>

This number will be reflected on the Purchase Order.
